Mr. Patrick Hannon joined the Human Smuggling and Trafficking Center (HSTC) in July 2017. The HSTC is an interagency Center, designated in law with a mission to provide multi-source and multi-agency data fusion and analysis to assist law enforcement and policymakers in preventing trafficking, protecting victims and prosecuting traffickers.

Mr. Hannon was promoted to the Senior National Intelligence Service in 2014 at which time he served as the Director, Mission Engagement Division. In this capacity, Mr. Hannon worked directly for the Intelligence Community (IC) Chief Information Officer (CIO) and interacted with stakeholders from across the IC to ensure that customers took advantage of advanced capabilities to generate new mission insights, increase their speed to delivery and improve their confidence levels.

Prior to this role, Mr. Hannon served as the Chief, Needs Analysis & Program Assessments Group for the IC CIO. In this role, Mr. Hannon led community efforts to elicit, analyze, and define customer/stakeholder needs and worked to address them via the development and delivery of critical initiatives and services.

Prior to joining the IC CIO, Mr. Hannon served as Chief of Planning and Evaluation for the National Intelligence Manager for Counterterrorism within the National Counterterrorism Center (NCTC). Mr. Hannon represented IC counterterrorism equities at all levels of government, oversaw strategies and plans, assessed performance, identified key capabilities and ran initiatives to optimize mission execution.

Mr. Hannon joined the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) in 2006 and served as the Advanced Capabilities Lead for the IC

Mission Requirements Board, where he directed major program reviews and drove the development, review and validation of various capabilities. Among his many efforts, Mr. Hannon led the IC Interagency Task Force on Identity Intelligence and served as a Senior Staff Officer for the Policy, Plans and Requirements Directorate where he led the Directorate's efforts to implement Intelligence Community Directive 501, *Discovery and Dissemination or Retrieval of Information within the Intelligence Community*.

Mr. Hannon joined the National Geospatial Agency (NGA) as a Federal Civil Servant in 2003 and served as Chief, Sensor Assessment and Outreach Division, InnoVision Directorate. In this capacity, he planned and managed end-to-end multi-million dollar classified programs involving myriad IC and Department of Defense (DoD) organizations.

In 2000, Mr. Hannon served as a consultant with the NGA and was the focal point for the development, placement, and implementation of an NGA presence at mission partner facilities enabling multi-source intelligence exploitation. During this time, Mr. Hannon also was a key player in the development of the first-ever IC Geospatial Implementation Strategy providing authoritative guidance for geospatial activities throughout the IC and DoD.

Prior to his service within the IC, Mr. Hannon served with distinction as a United States Air Force Intelligence Officer.
